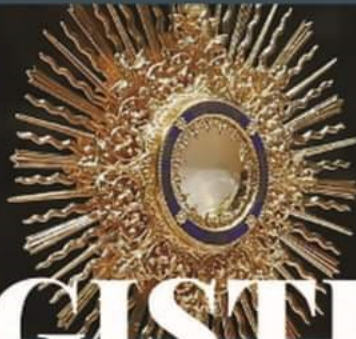

MESSAGE FROM THE PASTOR

Cardinal Joseph Van Thuan, the Vietnamese cardinal who spent thirteen years in prison under the Communists, used to say that persecution is one of the ever-present signs of the true Church. He used to say that the true Church founded by Christ is one, holy, catholic, apostolic, and persecuted.

St Paul also understood this. One of his most famous passages is from his Letter to the Ephesians, Chapter 6: "*For it is not against human enemies that we have to struggle, but against the Sovereignities and the Powers who originate the darkness in this world, the spiritual army of evil.*" The history of the Church proves that this battle is real, not just symbolic, starting with the Apostles themselves. Every one of Jesus' first Apostles died a martyr's death - except St John the Evangelist, who miraculously survived being boiled in oil.

1. **Peter** was crucified upside down in Rome.
2. **James** the Greater was beheaded in Jerusalem.
3. **Andrew** was crucified on a cross in the shape of an X.
4. **Bartholomew** was skinned alive and crucified in Armenia.
5. **Philip** was stoned and then crucified in Turkey.
6. **Thomas** was speared to death in India.
7. **James** the Lesser was hurled from the city walls of Jerusalem and beaten to death with stones and clubs.
8. **Jude** was shot to death by arrows, in Persia, while tied to a cross.
9. **Matthew** was burned to death in Afghanistan. Although the mode and exact location of his martyrdom are disputed, but not the fact.
10. **Simon the Zealot** was sawed to pieces in the Kingdom of Georgia.

These are our older brothers in faith. They teach us that being a Christian is demanding; it takes courage; it stirs up opposition. They followed in Christ's footsteps and blazed the trail for us to do the same.

MENSAJE DEL PÁRROCO

El cardenal Joseph Van Thuan, el cardenal vietnamita que pasó trece años en prisión bajo los comunistas, solía decir que la persecución es uno de los signos siempre presentes de la verdadera Iglesia. Decía que la verdadera Iglesia fundada por Cristo es una, santa, católica, apostólica y perseguida.

San Pablo también entendió esto. Uno de sus pasajes más famosos es de su Carta a los Efesios, Capítulo 6: "Porque no es contra los enemigos humanos contra los que tenemos que luchar, sino contra los Soberanos y Potestades que originan las tinieblas en este mundo, el ejército espiritual de demonio." La historia de la Iglesia prueba que esta batalla es real, no sólo simbólica, comenzando por los mismos Apóstoles. Todos los primeros apóstoles de Jesús murieron como mártires, excepto San Juan el Evangelista, quien sobrevivió milagrosamente al ser hervido en aceite.

1. **Pedro** fue crucificado cabeza abajo en Roma.
2. **Santiago** el Mayor fue decapitado en Jerusalén.
3. **Andrés** fue crucificado en una cruz en forma de X.
4. **Bartolomé** fue desollado vivo y crucificado en Armenia.
5. **Felipe** fue apedreado y luego crucificado en Turquía.
6. **Tomás** fue asesinado con una lanza en la India.
7. **Santiago** el Menor fue arrojado desde las murallas de la ciudad de Jerusalén y muerto a golpes con piedras y garrotes.
8. **Judas** fue asesinado a tiros con flechas, en Persia, mientras estaba atado a una cruz.
9. **Mateo** murió calcinado en Afganistán. Aunque se discute el modo y el lugar exacto de su martirio, no así el hecho.
10. **Simón** el Zelote fue aserrado en pedazos en el Reino de Georgia.

Estos son nuestros hermanos mayores en la fe. Nos enseñan que ser Cristiano es exigente; se necesita coraje; suscita oposición. Siguió los pasos de Cristo y abrieron el camino para que nosotros hiciéramos lo mismo.

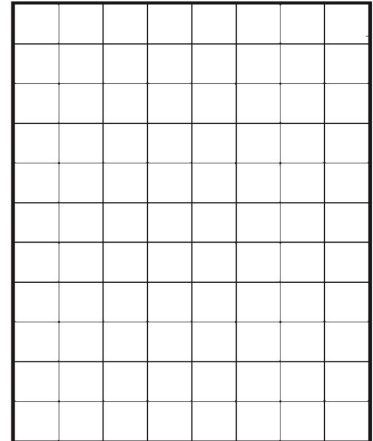
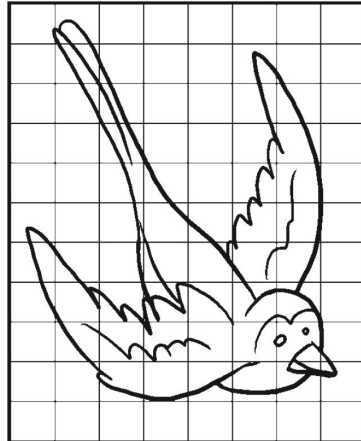

The Necklace

I have a necklace that originally belonged to my great-grandmother. I don't really know much about the man who gave it to her, most of those details have been lost to time. But I know that he wanted to marry her, and that she refused, and it had something to do with religion — ultimately, he did not share her faith. And while I've certainly seen many interfaith couples have loving and successful marriages, in this particular case, my great-grandmother discerned that this would not be one of those marriages.

Like I said, I don't have many details about this man, but I know that she felt she couldn't marry him because it might jeopardize the souls of her children, and therefore the souls of their children, and their children after them — me. She turned him down because of me.

My great-grandmother never sold that necklace, not even when the Great Depression further reduced her financial circumstances. She kept it, and she gave it to her daughter, who gave it to her daughter, who gave it to me. The necklace is always given with a warning: there is something worse than being poor, worse than being scared, worse even than being desperate. Worse than all of these things is separation from God.

When I wear this necklace, I think about my grandmother and this man she possibly loved a hundred years ago. I think of the many decisions we make every day — large and small, good and bad — that reverberate down through the generations in ways we cannot, at the time, imagine. I think of the God who knows every hair on my head.

Why do we do that? Catholic Life Explained

Question:

What is Lectio Divina, and how is it associated with the Benedictine Monastic tradition, whose founder, St. Benedict, we honor on July 11?

Answer:

Benedict desired his monks to live in community, praying the Liturgy of the Hours together, contemplating sacred texts, and doing manual labor. The monks developed a technique to facilitate a spiritual and devotional reading of the Bible known as Lectio Divina, the holy reading of a text. This method encourages the reader to hear the biblical text with an open heart and focus on whatever God wants to highlight and then apply it to daily life.

There are variations on Lectio Divina, but essentially, the technique consists of a three-step process of reflection. When the reflection is done with a group, the responses are shared by all the participants. Once the text is selected, it is read meditatively, and the following are then explored: a word or phrase that attracts you; how and where the content of this reading touches your life today; what you believe that God wants you to do during this coming week (month, year, lifetime).

Thanks to Benedict, the Christian community has been gifted with this special way of entering into the biblical text. This week, use the Lectio Divina process on one of the readings for the coming Sunday and make a note of the life connections you are making. How is this reflection on the biblical text drawing you closer to God and others?

Communal Weddings

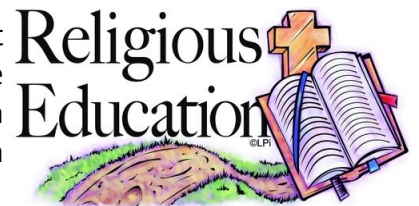
