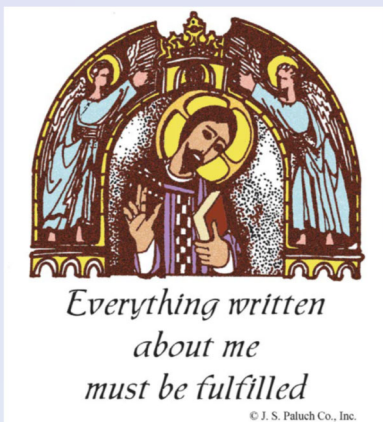

Pastors Message,

Every time we line up for communion, we hear the phrase “**THE BODY OF CHRIST**”. We say “**AMEN**” and we receive the Eucharist often not giving so much of a thought about it. If we reflect once again on the phrase, we will recognize that “The Body of Christ” is a profound statement. Now, does it refer only to the Eucharistic species, the consecrated bread or does the phrase refers to us as the Body of Christ - People of God or Both?

St. Paul talked about the Body of Christ as a way to express the reality of his own conversion experience: dying to sin and rising to new life in Christ. The image of “body” expresses the diversity, the interrelatedness and the unity of all believers – the Church.

During the Eucharistic Prayer at Mass, the priest asks God the Father to send the Holy Spirit upon the gifts of bread and wine so that they may become for us the Body and Blood of our Lord Jesus Christ. The second part of the prayer invokes the Spirit again, asking that all who share in the Body and Blood of Christ be brought together in unity and become one body, one spirit in Christ. These two prayers reflect the insight of the early Church that by partaking in Holy Communion we become what we eat: The Body of Christ!

One of the challenge we see or hear often is that the recipients are not ready to say “**Amen**”. Often, I hear, “**Thank you Father**”, “**Bless you Father**” and so on.... These are however, not the appropriate response to receive the sacrament. **Saying “Amen,” means we assent to our faith with our intellect, heart and will. Not only do we believe in the real presence, but we also commit ourselves to living and acting as Jesus did and does.** Tertullian, a 3rd century theologian, taught that our “AMEN” is referred similar to the oath of allegiance that soldiers made to the Roman emperor to serve him, even with their life. At this time in the Church’s history, persecutions were common enough to make baptism into Christ a commitment that could mean dying for the faith. **Thus, saying “Amen” to the sacrament of the Body and Blood of Christ serves as a Catholic pledge of allegiance to follow Christ.** “Amen”, in other words, is a powerful pledge of allegiance to Christ in whom we have placed our Faith.

Have a Blessed Season of Easter!

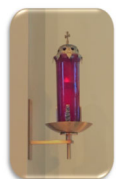

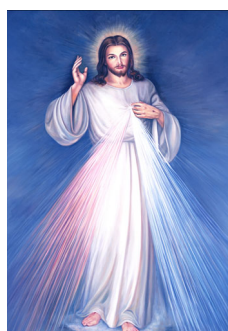

Mensaje del Pastor,

Cada vez que nos formamos para la Comunión, escuchamos la frase “EL CUERPO DE CRISTO”. Nosotros decimos, “AMEN” y recibimos la Eucaristía, y a menudo no pensamos mucho en eso. Si reflexionamos una vez en la frase, nos daremos cuenta de que “El Cuerpo de Cristo” es una declaración muy profunda. Ahora, ¿se refiere solo a las especies Eucarísticas, el pan consagrado o la frase se refiere también a nosotros como el Cuerpo de Cristo - la Gente de Dios o a ambos?

San Pablo habla acerca del Cuerpo de Cristo como la forma de expresar la realidad de su propia experiencia de conversión: morir al pecado y naciendo a una nueva vida en Cristo. La imagen de “cuerpo” expresa la diversidad, la interrelación y la unidad de todos los creyentes - la Iglesia.

Durante la Oración Eucarística en Misa, el sacerdote le pide a Dios el Padre, que envíe al espíritu santo sobre las ofrendas de pan y vino para que se conviertan en el Cuerpo y la Sangre de Cristo de Nuestro Señor Jesucristo, para nosotros. La segunda parte de la oración invoca una vez más al Espíritu Santo, pidiendo que todos los que comparten el Cuerpo y la Sangre de Cristo vengan juntos y se conviertan en un solo cuerpo y un solo espíritu en Cristo. Estas dos oraciones reflejan el discernimiento de la iglesia primitiva para que al participar en la Sagrada Comunión nos convertimos en lo que escuchamos: ¡El Cuerpo de Cristo!

Uno de los retos que vemos o escuchamos muchas veces que los recipientes no están listos para decir “Amén”. Algunas veces escuchamos, “Gracias Padre”, “Dios lo bendiga Padre” y otras cosas... De cualquier manera, esta no es la respuesta apropiada para recibir el Sacramento. **Diciendo “Amén,” significa que nosotros asentamos nuestra fe y nuestro intelecto, nuestro corazón y nuestra voluntad. No solo creemos en la presencia real, sino que también nos comprometemos a vivir y actuar como Jesús lo hizo y hace.** Tertuliano, un teólogo del siglo tercero, enseñó que nuestro “AMEN” es similar al juramento de lealtad que hacen los soldados al emperador romano de servirlo, aún con su vida. En estos tiempos en la historia de la Iglesia, las persecuciones eran muy comunes para hacer que el bautismo en Cristo fuera un compromiso que podía significar morir por su fe. **Así que, diciendo “Amén” al sacramento del Cuerpo y la Sangre de Cristo sirve como un juramento de lealtad católico para seguir a Cristo.** “Amén”, en otras palabras, es un juramento de lealtad muy poderoso hacia Cristo en quien hemos depositado nuestra fe.

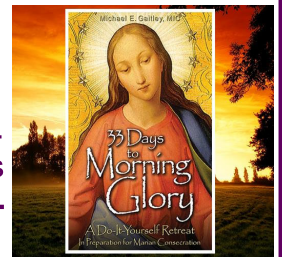
